Community Organizing Intervention Development on Changing Dominant Carceral Attitudes

Description: Qualitative case study methods will be used to iterate an intervention that elicits desired response – a change in anti-Black racial attitudes and increase in support of decarceration policy. Study will consist of a sample of ~30 participants and will be conducted over 12-18 months.

Role: Sole researcher on project, responsible for research conceptualization and design, collaborative decision-making with community partner coalition, IRB and funding application submissions, intervention model development, assessment of data, ensuring intervention fidelity, assisting in refinement of iteration as part of iterative process, analyzing final data and writing up findings.

Description: A statewide survey measured Masters of Social Work students' affective, cognitive, and behavioral responses to experiences of racism (for students of color) and racial tension (for white students). Goal of study is to identify pattern clusters that correlate with high levels of anti-racist behavior and empowerment to inform intervention development.
